#### **OBJECTIVES OF THE COURSE**

The course will introduce students to the different types of sexual and violent offenders, the causes underlying their criminal behavior, their perceived dangerousness and clinical diagnosis, as well as the rehabilitation and management of such offenders. Various expressions of violence will be examined, such as domestic violence, rape, sexual abuse against children, stalking etc. Emphasis will be given on understanding why some people are capable of such violent acts and whether they can be rehabilitated.

- 5. Evaluate the use of offender profiling strategies when investigating serious crimes
- 6. Assess the effectiveness of the different treatment and rehabilitation programs of offenders.
- 7. Critically discuss the issues and consequences associated with violent sex offender registration and community notification
