Course Objectives:

The main objectives of the course are to:

- explore the possibilities, therapeutic approaches and techniques used in teaching dance to children/adolescents with mild to moderate mental and physical disabilities.
- Investigate techniques for teaching the gifted child
- Analyse ideas regarding an integrated classroom for dance
- Provide perspectives on semi-professional and professional companies that work with performers with differently abled bodies, leading to the question and discussion about disability and performativity.

Learning Outcomes:

- 1. Teach the basic dance elements to differently abled and/or gifted children.
- 2. Distinguish between different forms of disabilities and select an appropriate approach to teaching.
- 3. Manage classroom activities in groups that include people with special needs.

- 5. Analyze and discuss professional pieces featuring differently abled performers.
- 6. Design a lesson plan for a group of children or adolescents with special needs.
