Course Objectives:

The main objectives of the course are to:

- Provide to students the opportunity of gaining further experience of working within a design group, architecture/interior design agency or appropriate production house. It will enable students to appreciate the requirements of the industry and to apply classroom theory into practice.
- Provide an understanding of the industry by visits to studios and agencies and a period of supervised professional placement with collaborating practitioners. Students are expected to become involved in all aspects of the design and construction process, and to critically reflect on this experience by completing a learning log and final report.
- Refer to the industries, organisations, regulations and procedures involved in translating design concepts into buildings and integrating studies into overall planning
- Enable students to appreciate the requirements of the industry and to apply classroom theory into practice.

Learning Outcomes:

After completion of the course students are expected to be able to:

1. Select appropriate knowledge of and understanding of the characteristics of building and finishing materials also an insight in architectural construction and technical systems;
2. Illustrate insight in the factors that safeguard and further the safety, health and well-being of the users of buildings and interiors, and the related laws and regulations;
3. Criticize the profession of the interior designer and the role in society; also of organizational,

- financial and legal aspects with regard to the design and the realization thereof;
4. Combine the demands of the users of an interior space within the limits of budget requirements, building codes and other related regulations;
 5. Demonstrate methods of research and preparation of projects; and also insight in procedures and processes of decision making.

Course Content:

- Written report of students' experience and activities
- Brief presentation
- Companies' report on students' progress.
- Basic information of the Company
- Analysis of the experience and feedback
- Assistance and guidance from personnel in the organization, faculty members, advisors, the library and any other sources.
- Company's questionnaire/report in relation to the student's collaborative personality, progress and employment.
