Objectives of the Course:

The law of evidence continues with good emphasis placed on the law relating to hearsay in the Cypriot legal system. The semester will begin by focusing on the presentation of evidence in court and conclude with the production of documents.

Learning Outcomes:

After completion of the course students are expected to be able to:

1. Express a thorough and applied knowledge of the basic concepts of circumstantial evidence.
2. Assess and evaluate similar facts evidence and character evidence.
3. Discuss the procedural issues of producing evidence, of the witness system, and of the course of evidence.
4. Explain estoppel and privilege evidence.
5. Assess and evaluate hearsay evidence, acknowledge the historical background and justification, as well as how the law stands today.
6. Appraise, assess and evaluate corroboration evidence.
7. Discuss confessions, assess the procedure in police stations, and to evaluate the Judge's Rules and the admissibility of confessions in Court.
8. Express a thorough and applied knowledge of the basic concepts of extrinsic evidence and opinion (expert) evidence.
9. State a reasoned legal decision.

Course Content:

1. Circumstantial Evidence
2. Facts relevant to the issue: similar facts evidence and character
3. Estoppel and privilege
4. Hearsay evidence: the law

5. Hearsay evidence: statutory and common-law exceptions
6. Confessions: the Judges Rules and admissibility of evidence
7. Extrinsic evidence
8. Opinion

Learning Activities and Teaching Methods:

Interactive lectures, tutorials, written examinations, classroom presentations and assignments

Assessment Methods:

One presentation on cases on Hearsay Evidence and Confessions, mid-term exam and final exam.
