1. Students are evaluated based on the activities that precede, coincide or follow the internship.
2. During the internship, students are expected to keep a Daily Log in which they record the types of activities involved together with notes on what they have visited, done, experienced, learned or attracted their attention and interest. Faculty are expected to either be with the student or visit the students and his/her supervisor periodically. Organizations are under no obligation to pay, but may pay if they wish, a stipend to the student doing an internship.
3. Following the internship, students will write a report in which they include elements referred to points 1 and 2 above as well as the recording and analysis of the learning that has taken place.
4. For this course, students may get a letter grade (A to D1) or opt for a Pass-Fail option
