Course Objectives:

The aims of this module are to enable students to examine critically and apply the principles and practices of an aspect of pharmacy through original research.

Learning Outcomes:

After completion of the course students are expected to:

- make effective use of different sources of information (literature, clinical data, laboratory data, interview/questionnaire responses, etc) that contribute to existing knowledge on the selected topic
- apply appropriate methods for analysing information and data collected so as to address the hypotheses/questions/problems, issues associated with the selected topic and the aim of the project
- discuss and/or challenge subject related theory, models and opinions
- critically interpret information and data within the context of existing, published materials, including the wider implications of the project
- draw conclusions in the interpretation of the collected information and data and to propose possible avenues for future study
- present the findings of the project in a style and quality appropriate to a research report
- plan and carry out a research investigation
- gather, analyse and interpret information and data obtained during a research investigation

- present, justify and defend the findings and implications of the research in the form of a research project

Course Content:

To carry out an independent research project (either lab based or bibliographic) and submit a written report (10,000 - 15,000 words).
