# Course Objectives:

The course explores current perspectives on the teaching and learning of grammar in the second/foreign language classroom. It introduces participants to modern approaches to teaching grammar and offers ideas for the creative and the communicative teaching of grammar. The course includes also a practical component (lesson plans for introducing grammatical categories, resources etc.)

# Learning Outcomes:

After completion of the course students are expected to be able to:

- 1. Discuss various approaches to teaching grammar and can compare them
- 2. Critically evaluate currently available grammar activities and books
- 3. Develop lesson plans for introducing grammatical categories using modern approaches (grammar in context)
- 4. Offer a variety of methods for assessing grammatical categories
- 5. Use various recourses for the design of grammar classes, including electronic ones



# **Course Content:**

Areas covered in the course include the following:

- 1. Approaches to teaching grammar (traditional grammar instruction, structural grammar and the audio-lingual and direct approaches, functional approaches, cognitive approaches, communicative language teaching and humanistic approaches)
- 2. Evaluation criteria for grammar activities and books
- 3. Ideas for the creative teaching of grammar
- 4. Learning grammar from rules (deductive learning), from examples (inductive learning), through texts
- 5. Teaching grammar in context and through discourse
- 6. Lesson plans for introducing grammatical categories
- 7. Methods of assessment of grammatical categories
- 8. Resources for the design of grammar classes

#### Learning Activities and Teaching Methods:

Recorded lectures, WebEx web conferencing, group discussions through ICT tools, individual and group work, videos

# **Assessment Methods:**

Exercises/collaborative projects, participation in weekly activities, writing assignment, final examination
