Course Objectives:

The main objectives of the course are to:

- Understand the value of cultural heritage in relation to the present and future
- Define the notion of tangible and intangible cultural heritage
- Identify the elements and categories that constitute heritage
- Understand the identity of monuments, cultural artefacts and traditions as they have developed over time
- Understand the identity of monuments, cultural artefacts and traditions that have been affected by and assimilated other cultures
- Identify and asses local elements of cultural heritage (tangible and intangible)
- Identify characteristics and lineage of local cultural heritage (tangible and intangible)
- Apply a methodological, reflective and critical approach to the analysis of heritage Become familiar with organizations involved in promoting and safeguarding heritage (locally and internationally)

Learning Outcomes:

After completion of the course students are expected to be able to:

- 1. Identify elements and categories that constitute heritage and give examples for each.
- 2. Describe characteristics of local heritage and assess its value in relation to identity and culture
- 3. Judge how the local culture has assimilated characteristics from different cultures
- 4. Outline and evaluate these characteristics through tangible and intangible elements of



heritage

- 5. Distinguish modern developments of cultural heritage and identify how they relate to historical precedents
- 6. Recognize and actively use the (local) databases, archives, education institutes and technology that is available for research of cultural artefacts
