Course Objectives:

The main objectives of the course are to:

- Familiarize participants with basic theories and concepts of town planning and urban design.
- Expose participants to main urban developments and their evolution through the 19th and 20th century.
- Promote sustainable urban development, the various dimensions and layers that define it and the complex relations between them.
- Provide a comprehensive understanding of various approaches to contextual urban design.
- Develop the students` capacity to address the complex and multi-layered fabric of the city and the system of forces that continuously reconfigure it.
- Improve students` research, reading and writing skills based on academic principles and rules.

Learning Outcomes:

After completion of the course students are expected to be able to:

- 1. State, explain and selectively apply the various approaches to contextual urban design.
- 2. Identify, describe and use principles and models of sustainable urban development considering the complex relationship of its various dimensions and layers.
- 3. Analyze an urban context in relation to economic, social, ecological and historic aspects, its various layers and their linkage in terms of form and function.
- 4. Assess urban design concerning its spatial, functional and aesthetic qualities and its response to physical context, humans and society.
- 5. Apply derived knowledge in urban design acknowledging that urban context is complex, multi-layered and continuously reconfigured.



6. Formulate an academic essay and support a hypothesis based on principles and rules for academic research and essay writing.
