Course Objectives:

The main objectives of the course are to:

- Situate students in a real-life environment outside the studio, where they are required to respond to specific and varied conditions on location.
- Thoughtfully appraise and position their own work within the broader spectrum of photographic practice and discourses on photography.
- Formulate appropriate problem solving and editing skills necessary for a creative practice
- Identify aesthetic and critical faculties, which would enable students to position their creative work imaginatively and appropriately within the public sphere.
- Produce project work that can stand on its own.

Learning Outcomes:

After completion of the course students are expected to be able to:

- 1. Demonstrate an ability to adapt and creatively relate to new environments / locations.
- 2. Assess and critically respond photographically to their surroundings.
- 3. Question and appraise photographic images.
- 4. Formulate connections that go beyond the obvious and demonstrate an analytical process of thought based on structural understanding of how photographic images work within a social context.
- 5. Operate a creative visual practice based on critical thinking.



- 6. Perform photographic practice that demonstrates an openness to different observational and analytical techniques.
- 7. Effectively assemble, present and evaluate photographic material.

Course Content:

Introduction to the course and mixed lighting; Site visit workshop; Seminar presentation; Students research project, present, ideas, discuss in class; Students photograph on location; Photographs are peer reviewed; One-to-one tutorials on project development; Students present and discuss results of their project; Students edit, write, support.

Learning Activities and Teaching Methods:

Seminars, Practical Workshops, Critique, Discussions, Practical Assignments, Visual Research Assignments, Written Assignments.

Assessment Methods:

Research and development, transition from research to developing final product/s, final outcome and presentation, attendance and participation.
