Course Objectives:

To introduce the student to the nature, implications and consequences of legal and corporate personality, examine the rules and principles which govern the formation, administration and the functioning of a company, as well as the relations between the company and outsiders and between the company and its members/shareholders.

Learning Outcomes:

After completion of the course students are expected to be able to:

- 1. Identify the different forms of business organizations.
- 2. Identify the formalities required for the formation of a private company and discuss the implications of the formation of a limited company.
- 3. Define the key differences between different types of corporate entities and analyse the concepts and consequences of corporate personality and limited liability.
- 4. Analyse the circumstances in which the veil of incorporation will be lifted by the judiciary and by Parliament.
- 5. Illustrate the duties of promoters and assess the principles governing pre-incorporation contracts.
- 6. Analyse the principles applicable to the memorandum and articles of association of a company in relation to the section 33 statutory contract.
- 7. Identify the responsibility of a company for tortious and criminal action.
- 8. Compose essay and problem style questions through applying the above.
