Objectives of the Course:

The main objectives of the course are to:

- Develop for students the theory and practice of public procurement law
- Introduce the concepts of public authorities, public contracts and tenderers
- Introduce the legislation and case - law concerning the selection of tenderers and award of public contract
- Introduce the student to the study of the EC and Cypriot law of public procurement
