Objectives of the Course

This performance course is intended for students who are either not a classical instrument as their primary study, or who would like to take extra chamber music lessons for elective credit. It is open to non-music majors who successfully pass an audition. The course improves the students' knowledge of chamber music repertory and skills in small ensemble performance.

Learning Outcomes

After completion of the course students are expected to be able to:

1. Identify their role in chamber ensembles and assess their contribution
2. Demonstrate the ability to perform in a small ensemble with adequate attention and skill at interacting efficiently with the other players, especially with regards to tempo, dynamics, articulation and phrasing, efficient breathing, intonation, balance, and articulation.
3. Interpret works in a stylistically appropriate manner
4. Analyze problems pertaining to performing in chamber ensembles and make
5. constructive criticism.
