Objectives of the Course:

The main objectives of the course are to:

- Understand and begin to apply legal and ethical issues in family care.
- Explore the concept of care planning along the life span continuum.
- Further develop therapeutic and technological communications skills.
- Develop the evidence-base used in nurturing, sensitivity, caring, empathy, commitment skills
