Course purpose and objectives	Preventive health care aims to prevent disease from occurring (primary prevention), reduce progression of disease by identifying it before it becomes symptomatic (secondary prevention), and decrease the impact of disease if it does occur (tertiary prevention). Community pharmacists are highly accessible health care professionals, providing opportunities for partnerships with other health care and public health professionals to expand the population's access to clinical preventive services. This module aimed at achieving consistent provision of a broad range of health promotion interventions through community pharmacies to meet the population needs, improving the health and wellbeing of the local population and helping to reduce health inequalities. Additionally, the students will acquire the knowledge and skills to provide prevention services through their community pharmacy.
