- To help students develop their skills in forming and evaluating philosophical arguments.

3. Analyze and evaluate the arguments presented in support of theories such as Cartesian Dualism, Functionalism and Behaviourism.

5. Take advanced courses in the philosophy of mind and/or the philosophy of psychology.

11. Consciousness.
