This is the first of a two-semester thesis sequence during which students are expected to develop, design and pursue an original year-long research project in the field of Clinical Psychology, under the supervision of a faculty member. Students have the option of carrying out empirical research or original theoretical research. Students are expected to select a thesis advisor and obtain topic approval prior to registering for Thesis.

- To define the hypotheses that will be examined
- To describe the proposed methodology
- To identify the relevant research tools
- To obtain approval by the University Research Ethics Committee and the National Bioethics Committee wherever human subjects participate in the research project.
