### Course Objectives:

This is the fourth and final course in a sequence of courses leading up to the completion of the Thesis project, which must follow a Journal Article Style Format. Students are expected to actively work on their selected research project using the methodology they developed over the course of the previous semester. By the end of this semester, students are expected to submit a completed manuscript in journal article style format (of a reputable journal chosen in collaboration with their thesis advisor). The final project, which will be graded by the main thesis supervisor and a second grader, must be to a publishable standard. The main objectives of this stage of the Thesis are to:

- Follow the methodology that was designed over the course of the previous semester.
- Discuss the findings of their research and arrive at relevant conclusions that enhance knowledge around the selected research topic.
- Identify the limitations of their study.
- Propose directions for future research pertaining to their research area.

### Learning Outcomes:

After completion of the course students are expected to be able to:

1. Produce an original journal article style manuscript and communicate research findings.
2. Discuss research findings.
3. Identify possible limitations of the project.

4. Critically identify, evaluate and discuss the ways in which the completed project advances knowledge in the field of counseling psychology.
