Course Objectives:

This course aims to introduce students to the Turkish language and Culture. During the course, students will have the opportunity to explore the Turkish language through the language analysis levels (phonological, morphological, syntactical) to be able to understand and use language. This course will help students to develop Turkish language skills in listening, speaking, reading, and writing. Through various thematic sections, students will also be able to use everyday vocabulary and sentence structures in communication.

Learning Outcomes:

After completion of the course, students will be able to:

- Distinguish between neutral/basic Turkish sentence structures and marked structures (identification clauses),
- Describe their day, their future plans, and their experiences.
- Understand and use a basic Turkish Modality System.

Course Content:

- The Turkish Tense System (Past Tense, Present Tense, Future Tense)
- Suffixation processes.
- Optative and Imperative Mood.
- Nominal and Predicative Sentences.

- Expressions of Ability, Permission, and Possibility.
- Personal Suffixes.
- Existential Sentences.
- References to Turkish Culture through music or literature.

Learning Activities and Teaching Methods:

Interactive lectures; discussion with class participation.
Through 'simple' linguistic analyses of phonology, morphology, and syntax, students will be able to compare and 'match' Turkish with their own first language. Using this method, students can understand the differences between their L1 and Turkish surface structure.
During the course, many visual and audio materials are used. At this level communication and speaking in class is supported and encouraged.

Course attendance, writing assignments, mid-term exam, final exam
