

1. Framework

The NFT field typically classifies art NFTs as follows



^{*} While generally people think about this as 1/1 pieces, editions of 1/1 pieces are most properly thought of in this category also



Most 1 of 1 NFTs fall in the broader tradition of digital art...

- Digital Art refers to art that incorporates digital technology, either in the creative input or in the presentational layer
- As with any horizontal term like this, the exact scope of digital art tends to be contested and should be taken more as an indicative term rather than a hard boundary condition
- As the world progressively digitizes and as digital tools become more common, the boundaries are less clear. For example, is a photograph taken on film, edited in Photoshop, and printed on paper, "digital art"? Under the initial definition, "yes", but in a more contemporary context, a more active interaction between the technology and the work is considered more important
- Pre-internet and pre-PC digital art tended to involve physical installations. NFTs are potentially a very interesting ownership layer for art that is 100% digital



2. CryptoArt


Rare Pepes and the beginning of CryptoArt



- o First blockchain community where anyone can submit artwork to be bought, sold, traded, or destroyed on the blockchain
- o Zero commission marketplace
- First gift card system that allows for gifting artwork to people who do not own any cryptocurrency
- First to move a digitally scare artwork to a physical piece of hardware (opendime)
- First to create a digital artwork tied to the blockchain that changes its representation based on what machine it is displayed on.

ArtNome's definition (1 / 2)




While no single CryptoArtist or CryptoArtwork adheres to a single definition, there are common factors that have shaped the aesthetic and community thus far:

- Digitally native: Artwork can be created, editioned, bought, and sold digitally.
- Geographically Agnostic: Empowered by the internet, artists
 participate from all over the world. CryptoArt is the first truly global
 art movement.
- o **Democratic/Permissionless:** Everyone is encouraged to participate regardless of skills, training, class, gender, race, age, creed, etc.
- o **Decentralized:** Tools and guidelines are designed to reduce the power of gatekeepers and middlemen and increase the autonomy of artists.
- Anonymous: Use of pseudonyms allows artists to create and sell art while staying anonymous (if preferred), freeing them from social judgment.

ArtNome's definition (1 / 2)



- Memetic: CryptoArt are often literally memes valued for their ability to spread quickly.
- Self-Referential: CryptoArtists often play with references to key events and personalities within cryptocurrency and blockchain culture.
- CryptoPatrons: CryptoArt is collected by the CryptoRich: a group of savvy technologists and investors who got into cryptocurrency early
- Pro-Artist: Blockchain platforms often take little to no commission from artists. Artists are often remunerated for every future sale of a single work.
- Dankness: Because CryptoArt is open to everyone, judging it by traditional artistic standards kills what is great about it. Instead, it is best to judge CryptoArt by "dankness" or potency of expression and creativity.










The Lost Robbies

Everydays by Beeple






aka Mike Winkelmann

- O Beeple creates and posts a new work of art online every day since May 2007
- Individually known as EVERYDAYS, collectively, the pieces form the first 5000 days were auctioned as an NFT - EVERYDAYS: THE FIRST 5000 DAYS
- The artist stitched together recurring themes and color schemes to create an aesthetic whole while organized in loose chronological order
- It was auctioned at Christie's in March 2021 and was purchased for \$69M. It remains the highest NFT sale (by far)







Currently, he is working on his series, LUCI which debuted on SuperRare as NFTs in October 2021 and most recently was auctioned at Christie's. - Sasha Stiles is a first-generation Kalmyk-American poet, artist and Al researcher probing the intersection of text and technology.
- O Her cross-media work -- which has been honored in the Future Art Awards, nominated for the Pushcart Prize and Best of the Net, exhibited at the Museum of Contemporary Digital Art, Miami Art Week, SXSW, New York Fashion Week and Virtual Times Square, and published as NFTs -- seeks to decipher the hidden language of the dawning Novacene, fusing elements of semiotics, translation, computer science, speculative design, visual poetry and conceptual art.
- Stiles' binary-based series, such as Cursive Binary, challenge reductive thinking, merging biological and mechanical, analog and digital, historical and modern to explore transhuman communication and transcendent possibility. She often incorporates elements of nature, investigating nonhuman intelligence and the ethos of consciousness.



5. Conclusions

Takeaways from week 4

- CryptoArt and 1/1 NFT art falls broadly within the tradition of Digital Art
- CryptoArt, as originally defined, tended to focus on more inclusive participation in art, without formal gatekeepers, often with a memetic orientation
- o 1/1 NFT art is now a superset of CryptoArt, with a broad horizontal orientation across all genres of art. In time, it is likely that it will be fully reflective of (most) art movements
- 1/1 NFT art tends to be the lowest volume sector of the NFT spaces and generally trades on specialized marketplaces
