## HONORARY DEGREE

### Professor Harris Pastides

Harris Pastides was born in New York City to immigrants from Cyprus. The first member of his family to attend college, he obtained a Master of Public Health and PhD in Epidemiology from Yale University. In 1988, he served as a Senior Fulbright Research Scholar and Visiting Professor at the University of Athens Medical School (Greece) and, in 1993, he was appointed as Professor of Epidemiology and Chairman of the Department of Biostatistics and Epidemiology at the University of Massachusetts Amherst. He joined the University of South Carolina (USC) faculty in 1998, initially as Dean of the Arnold School of Public Health, and later as Vice President for Research and Health Sciences for the university. His election as University President in 2008 marked the first internal candidate for the presidency in more than half a century. As the 28th President of USC (2008-2019), he led during an eleven-year period of great challenges, with resounding success and unprecedented growth.

The USC Honours College rose to become the nation's best public honours programme, and 47 undergraduate and graduate programmes gained top national academic rankings. More than 100,000 degrees were awarded during his tenure as president. Harris Pastides retired as Distinguished Professor Emeritus and Distinguished President Emeritus in June, 2019. However, on 21 May 2021, Prof Pastides was asked by the USC Board of Trustees to retake the helm of the University as Interim President.

In accordance with the concept that degree attainment significantly affects quality of life, Professor Pastides has spearheaded innovative programmes during his academic career, increasing access and affordability to many who would normally not be able to attend university. In addition, he led an unprecedented capital campaign to fund essential needs for knowledge, research, discovery and development for the University of South Carolina system of eight universities.

Prof Pastides' contribution to society and his sensitivity to issues pertaining to population health and safety are also highlighted by a remarkable public health story during the 1980s. As an Associate Professor of Epidemiology at the University of Massachusetts, Prof Pastides managed to demonstrate that chemicals used at that time by the US semiconductor industry doubled the risk of miscarriages among female workers. Despite a vigorous attack from the relevant industry sector, his initial study was confirmed by others, and the specific sector ceased operating in the US.

This is considered by many experts as one of the greatest successes in occupational health history. His service to society and to health continues as he is the only non-physician member of the American Medical Association (AMA) Board of Trustees. Founded in 1847, the AMA represents over one million physicians in almost 200 state and specialty medical societies and other critical areas, "promoting the art and science of medicine and the betterment of public health." Despite being a first-generation Cypriot in the US, Prof Pastides never forgot the motherland of his parents. In particular, he was instrumental in developing, for the first time, a Cancer registry in Cyprus. This has huge implications for public health in Cyprus, as the Registry facilitates better diagnosis, treatment, monitoring of trends, as well as research in the area of cancer.

The academic and social work of Prof Pastides did not go unnoticed by his fellow Greek Cypriots in the US, nor by the Cypriot Government. In September 2018, the Cyprus Federation of America, in recognition of his leadership, outstanding achievements and contribution to academia, honoured him with a Lifetime Achievement Award, presented by the President of the Republic of Cyprus. He was awarded the Medal of Honour by the Ellis Island Foundation and is one of seven initial recipients of Fulbright's Global Changemaker Award from the Institute of International Education.

Regarding our own University, Prof Pastides has fostered the newly established collaboration between the University of Nicosia Medical School and the Arnold School of Public Health and the School of Medicine at the University of South Carolina. The agreement covers the exchange of students, faculty and staff, and the development of collaborative

opportunities in research and education, something that greatly boosts our University's potential for excellence in both teaching and research. In October of 2019, following the retirement of Prof Pastides from USC, the University of Nicosia Senate unanimously endorsed the award of the Degree of Doctor of Science (Medicine) honoris causa.



## HONORARY DEGREE

### Professor Paul Kymissis

Professor Paul Kymissis has a remarkable and distinguished career of more than 50 years in the medical profession, in medical education and in research innovation. He has contributed significantly to the advancement of the psychiatric profession in Cyprus and Greece, and he has been a major contributor to the Greek American community of New York.

Professor Kymissis was born in 1944 in Larnaca. He studied Medicine at the University of Athens from where he graduated in 1968, and then he trained as a neurologist and psychiatrist in Greece. After being certified by the Greek Boards of Psychiatry and Neurology, he moved to the United States where he was trained in Adult and Child Psychiatry at Mount Sinai Medical Center in New York.

Since 1977, Professor Kymissis has served as faculty member in medical schools in New York, including Mt Sinai and New York Medical College. He has been an Attending Psychiatrist at the Elmhurst General Hospital and the Chief Psychiatrist at the Children's Village from 2002 to 2015. He has also served as the President of the World Hellenic Biomedical Association during the period 1998-2000.

He has made great efforts in supporting the establishment of the University of Nicosia Medical School, the first medical school founded in Cyprus in 2011. During the period 2011-2015, he served as a Professor of Psychiatry and Honorary Dean of the

Medical School, and he is the Founding Chairman of Psychiatry at the University of Nicosia Medical School, where he served until June of 2019.

Professor Kymissis is Board certified in Adult and Child Psychiatry by the American Academy of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry; he is a Fellow of the American Academy of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry, a Life Distinguished Fellow of the American Psychiatric Association, and since 1993 a Fellow of the American Group Psychotherapy Association.

Throughout his clinical and academic career, Professor Kymissis has been honoured a number of times for his services and outstanding contribution to the field of psychiatry as well as to other related sciences. In particular, in 1990 he received the Distinguished Faculty Award from the Department of Psychiatry in Mount Sinai School of Medicine. In 2011, he was honoured as Colleague of the Year by the Hellenic Medical Society of New York and he also received the Delphic Prize by the Hellenic Society for Advancement of Psychiatry and related Sciences. Professor Kymissis holds the title of the Honorary President of the Cyprus Psychiatric Association.

Professor Kymissis' work has had a major impact on psychiatry in Cyprus, Greece and the United States. In October of 2019, the University of Nicosia Senate unanimously endorsed the award of the Degree of Doctor of Science (Medicine) honoris causa.

## THE HIPPOCRATIC OATH

*To be recited by the Graduates of the MBBS and MD programmes only*

I swear to fulfil, to the best of my ability and judgment, this covenant:

I will respect the hard-won scientific gains of those physicians in whose steps I walk, and gladly share such knowledge as is mine with those who are to follow.

I will apply, for the benefit of the sick, all measures [that] are required, avoiding those twin traps of overtreatment and therapeutic nihilism.

I will remember that there is art to medicine as well as science, and that warmth, sympathy, and understanding may outweigh the surgeon's knife or the chemist's drug.

I will not be ashamed to say "I know not," nor will I fail to call in my colleagues when the skills of another are needed for a patient's recovery.

I will respect the privacy of my patients, for their problems are not disclosed to me that the world may know. Most especially must I tread with care in matters of life and death.

I will remember that I do not treat a fever chart, a cancerous growth, but a sick human being, whose illness may affect the person's family and economic stability. My responsibility includes these related problems, if I am to care adequately for the sick.

I will prevent disease whenever I can, for prevention is preferable to cure.

I will remember that I remain a member of society, with special obligations to all my fellow human beings, those sound of mind and body as well as the infirm.

If I do not violate this oath, may I enjoy life and art, respected while I live and remembered with affection thereafter. May I always act so as to preserve the finest traditions of my calling and may I long experience the joy of healing those who seek my help.
